This matter is before the Court upon the letter request received June 9, 2014 by Mr. Joseph T. Halford, an Assistant Professor of Finance at the University of Wisconsin ("Professor Halford") for exemption from the fees imposed by the Electronic Public Access fee schedule adopted by the Judicial Conference of the United States Courts.

THEREFORE the Court finds that Professor Halford, as an individual academic researcher associated with the University of Wisconsin, Sheldon B. Lubar School of Business, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, falls within the class of users listed in the fee schedule as being eligible for a fee exemption. Additionally, Professor Halford has demonstrated that an exemption is necessary in order to avoid unreasonable burdens and to promote public access to information.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Professor Halford shall be exempt from the payment of fees for access via PACER to the electronic case files maintained in this Court, to the extent such use is incurred in the course of research regarding the potential impact hedge funds and debtor - in - possession (DIP) financing may have on the bankruptcy and restructuring process; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED Professor Halford shall not be exempt from the payment of fees incurred in connection with other uses of the PACER system in this Court; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED that the following limitations apply: (1) this fee exemption applies only to Professor Halford and is valid only for the purpose stated above; (2) this fee exemption applies only to the electronic case files of this Court that are available through the PACER system; (3) Professor Halford shall not sell for profit any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption; (4) Professor Halford is and shall be prohibited from transferring any data obtained as a result of receiving this exemption; (5) this exemption is valid until January 31, 2015; (6) if necessary, Professor Halford may request an extension of the fee exemption granted in this Order, based upon an additional showing of need conforming to Judicial Conference Policy; and it is

FURTHER ORDERED this exemption may be revoked at the discretion of the Court at any time and a copy of this Order shall be sent to the PACER Service Center.
