**ORDER GRANTING EXEMPTION
FROM PAYMENT OF PACER FEES**

This Court recognizes that the United States Congress has given the Judicial Conference of the United States authority to impose user fees for electronic access to case information;

This Court further recognizes that individual courts have the authority to waive user fees for parties that satisfy certain established criteria in order to facilitate access to the Court's PACER electronic case information;

Upon review of the application to waive PACER fees from Michigan State University College of Law Professor Anne Lawton, this court finds good cause to exempt Anne Lawton, Associate Professor of Law, from payment of fees associated with her use of the PACER system for the period beginning on April 1, 2009, and ending on March 31, 2010. Professor Lawton is conducting academic research on chapter 11 that requires access to thousands of individual and business chapter 11 cases. The data collected will be used to produce scholarly articles about the plan-confirmation process both before and after the passage of BAPCPA. A fee waiver would promote public access to court information, as publications resulting from access to such information would be available to the public, thereby increasing public knowledge and promoting better understanding of the bankruptcy system and the process of plan confirmation under chapter 11.

It is so ORDERED.
