ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 16-09

Based upon the unanimous decision of the NYNB Board of Judges at a meeting held on December 14, 2016, the following rules shall apply in a case converted from chapter 11 to chapter 7, in which there are assets and a claims bar date is to be noticed.

1. If the original bar date set in the chapter 11 case for governmental units to file claims has expired, then the Clerk shall set a 90 day claims bar date from the first date set for the meeting of creditors in the chapter 7 case for both governmental units and general creditors to file claims.
2. If the original bar date set in the chapter 11 case for governmental units to file claims has not expired and there are 90 days or more for the period to run from the first date set for the meeting of creditors in the chapter 7 case, then the Clerk shall utilize the original governmental units' bar date as the claims bar date for governmental units and the Clerk shall set a 90 day claims bar date from the first date set for the meeting of creditors in the chapter 7 case for general creditors to file claims.
3. If the original bar date set in the chapter 11 case for governmental units to file claims has not expired and there are less than 90 days for the period to run, then the Clerk shall set a 90 day claims bar date from the first date set for the meeting of creditors in the chapter 7 case for both governmental units and general creditors to file claims.
